Duster parentage and forage production with improved yield and disease resistance

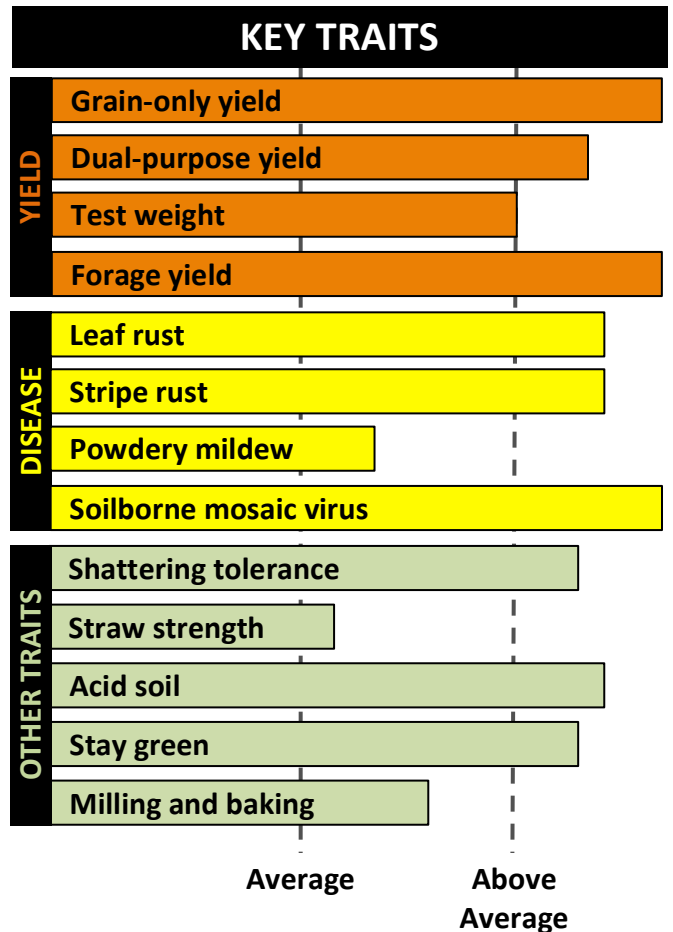
- Early maturity with good grazing tolerance
- 15% increase in seed size over Duster
- Resistant to current races of leaf and stripe rust
- Moderately resistant to tan spot
- Moderately resistant to BYDV
- Resistant to Wheat Soilborne and Wheat Spindle Streak Mosaic Viruses
- Septoria leaf blotch resistance for no-till or high-residue systems
- Acid soil tolerance comparable to Duster
- Hessian fly resistant
- Ability to exceed 12% grain protein with adequate fertilization

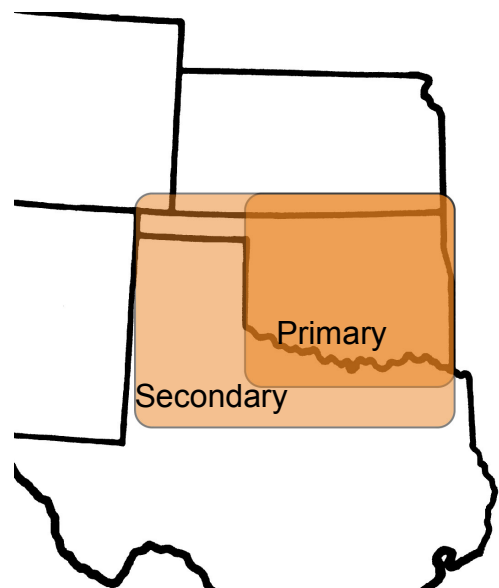
